# Keynote Speaker Mother Lynn Carter-Edmands, National Chaplain


The Rev'd Lynn Carter-Edmands has over thirty years of leadership experience as a priest in parish and diocesan ministry. This experience includes congregation and clergy transitions, vocational discernment and mentoring, formation and leadership development, and mediation and conflict transformation. Mother Lynn concluded eight years as a member of the Bishop's staff in the Diocese of Southern Ohio as the Canon to the Ordinary. She has served as the rector of two parishes and as a chaplain and teacher at a boy's boarding preparatory school where she

taught Bible, Ethics, and senior electives in religion.

Mother Lynn is certified in Transitional Ministry through the Interim Ministry Network and in the Appreciative Way and recently completed a year as the transition priest-in-charge of St. Alban's in Bexley, OH. She volunteers as a member of the Board of Directors of Healthy Congregations, Inc.

This summer she will return to General Convention as a deputy from the Diocese of Southern Ohio and also as a member of the Legislative Committee concerning Title IV Disciplinary Canons. Lynn is married to the Rev'd Frank A. Edmands II, also an Episcopal priest, and they live in the Columbus, OH area.

Mother Lynn has described herself as "an outgoing and encouraging leader committed to living and sharing the good news of Jesus to build up the body of Christ for our life in the world, offering my gifts and experience as a priest to bring out God's best in others as they bring out God's best in me." # **Workshop on Invitational Evangelism**

The main point is that folks invite us to talk about our faith all the time in conversation, but we allow our anxiety about being considered "one of *those* Christians" get in the way of our presenting our faith in a positive light. We also think we have nothing to say, because when we hear a phrase like "faith sharing," we think we're being asked to tell an "I once was lost but now am found" story. What people want us to share with them about our faith may be very different, in fact. Try the following exercise:

#### **M&M Exercise**

Pick an M&M at random from the package (or, if you don't have any M&Ms, pick one of the following colors: red, blue, green, yellow, orange, brown. Divide into one of the break-out rooms that corresponds to your color.

Note: we **could** just divide people randomly, assign them a color, and tell them to enjoy their package of M&Ms!

Take turns launching a conversation with the other people in your group on the topic that corresponds to your color. Consider as a group the way in which the conversation you've started does (not) present Christianity as attractive. Is there a different way of expressing the same feelings or concerns without the negative impact you've identified?

Red Describe something that angers or annoys you (about the church)

Blue Describe something (about the church) that gets you down.

Green Identify an area in which you long for personal spiritual growth.

Yellow Wax nostalgic about "the good old days (in the church)"

Orange Identify an issue that has you feeling anxious.

Brown Tell a joke about religion.





Feedback with the group as a whole—the point of the exercise is that we all have things to say about the life of faith that can either attract people to Christianity or push them away from it. Can we be honest about our experience of church in a way that invites others in?

Transforming our approach to evangelism might well require us to transform our own way of thinking about church!

### **Pray Dough**

While God is, of course, quite capable of healing us, or those for whom we intercede, without touch (Mt. 8), the laying on of hands combines God's healing power with the assurance of human compassion. That's quite a powerful combo, and an especially hard loss at a time when, even with the worst of COVID now behind us, many may still be feeling cut-off from the warmth of human contact.

God made us through and for contact. The Creator molding us from clay and Jesus declaring bread to be his flesh got us thinking about kneading dough as a tactile reminder of our human connection. That's how Pray Dough was born!

Each daughter should prepare a sandwich or quart-size zip-top bag containing a flour mixture:

```
1 cup flour—"I am the bread of life" (Jn 6)
```

1/4 cup table salt—"Have salt in yourselves" (Mk 9).

1 t. cream of tartar—Did you know that cream of tartar is a byproduct of the winemaking process?

At the time of the healing service, each daughter will gather together:

that flour mixture

1/3 c. of water—"If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water."(Jn 4)

½ Tablespoon of oil—"God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of gladness" (Heb 1)

A plate

As we begin to pray, we will mix the materials together in the bag, just as by seeking to mix such elements into our lives we participate in the work of healing. We will then turn the dough out onto our plates, and as we pray for each daughter who requests healing for herself or others (by way of private chat, for the sake of privacy), we will continue to work our Pray Dough in our hands, trusting that as we knead our prayers into the dough, so also will our sister knead our prayers out into herself from the dough.

Just as our prayers keep giving even after the words have gone silent, your Pray Dough will keep (if you put it back in the bag) for quite some time. You can dye it with food coloring or keep it plain. You can keep it yourself and/or pass some along to someone else! Take it out and work it between your hands whenever you happen to knead it.

Greetings from all of us in the Northern Indiana Diocesan Assembly. The year 2023 was a year of continued stabilization and a return from the disruptions that the pandemic created in how we live out our vows. Many of our chapters have resumed chapter meetings but have accepted Zoom meetings as a part of life. Our collaborative discipline during Lent in 2023 (and in 2024) was to encourage our members to save at least one dollar per day per member and we created a fund in our Diocesan account which was used to offset membership dues for Daughters whose chapters participated. This year the funds will be made available to support our members to attend the Triennial 2024 in Louisville, KY.

We are determined to continue to increase our membership by attracting young women and girls to create Junior Chapters. This is going to be necessary in all our chapters nationally for the continued survival of our Order.

Above all, we are doing our best to live out our vows, bearing our crosses through the battles of our earthly lives.

#### Daughters-at-Large

Province V currently has around 100 DALs. This is still a large number that I hope continues to decrease with DALS transferring into chapters. Every other month Province DAL Chairs meet via Zoom with the National DAL Chair. It is a valuable time of sharing.

One of our zoom calls noted that some Province DAL Chairs have a varying number of DALs in churches where there IS a DOK chapter. One of the main reasons given is that some DALs have little interest in attending chapter meetings. This is disappointing as well as disturbing! It has been reinforced to keep Province DAL Chairs connected with their Diocesan Presidents particularly when there is no DAL representative in a particular Diocesan Assembly. It is the National DAL Chair's goal that each Assembly would have their own DAL Chair.

This past September at my church I had spent time discussing with women of my parish what The Order of the Daughters of the King was all about. I had two women interested. My Diocesan President traveled over from Indianapolis to provide the orientation. Unfortunately, the two women interested changed their minds and decided not to proceed in the DOK study at this time.

On October 1, 2023 the National DAL Chair gathered on Zoom as many DAL Chairs that were available to discuss DAL goals. One of the DAL goals that was discussed was the understanding and participating in a sister to sister program. The Diocesan DOK book club that I am a part of has certainly made me feel that sense of belonging to an actual DOK community which is an example of how a sister to sister program can work.

As DAL Chair I set a goal to send a letter each year to my DALS. I sent a letter in Advent, 2023 to all DALs either via email or snail mail. This letter communicated what the Advent season means to me and referencing some of the contemplative writers I enjoy reading. I received a few positive responses of thanks.

I have had several opportunities to assist DALs in their transfer from one Province to another. I alerted the specific Province DAL Chair of these transfers. I believe that these DALs are still in process of finding a church that has a DOK chapter with the initial assistance from their new Province DAL Chair.

I continue to attend monthly Province V Board meetings now not just as a DAL, but finishing the term of a Vice-President who resigned.

The last few months I have been the Chair of the Spring Assembly Planning Committee. The Assembly will be held virtually April 12th and 13th. DALS have been encouraged to attend too.
